



**FYNEFACE DUMNAMENE FYNEFACE** is an Environmental Justice Activist, Human Rights Defender, Facilitator of Platform for the Coordination of Niger Delta Ex-artisanal Refiners and Executive Director, Youths and Environmental Advocacy Centre (YEAC), a nongovernmental organization with over 10years experience. Fyneface has authored/co-authored over ten different publications (reports and books) on different subject-matters including Climate Change, Artisanal Crude Oil Refining, Ogoni Clean-up, Killing for Banana, Flooding, Photography, etc. and currently mobilizing and building a network of **“One Million Youth Volunteers in the Niger Delta”**. Fyneface had received professional training in journalism, environment, climate change mitigation, conflict resolution and peace-building mechanisms, etc from both local and international organizations and institutions from International Center for journalists (ICFJ) USA, United Nations REDD<sup>+</sup> Academy, International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP-2018) organized by the United States Department of State, etc. He had addressed many local and international conference including the media to draw attention to the issues in the Niger Delta including the 71<sup>st</sup> Session of the United Nations General Assembly where he addressed world leaders alongside President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR and pushed for the immediate commencement of the Ogoni cleanup with a view of extending it to other Niger Delta communities as soon as possible. He had also spoken as guest speaker at San Francisco State University (2016) USA; Californian State Legislature (2016), USA; Standing Rock, South Dakota, USA (2018); Africa Regional Conference on Biodiversity, Kenya (2019) and thrice at the Nigeria’s National Assembly in February and March (2020) on environment and Artisanal refining. Academically, Fyneface studied Educational Management and Political Science (2010) and Postgraduate Diploma in International Affairs (2014) from the University of Port Harcourt. In 2017, he was awarded a Master’s Degree in Political Science, International Relations and Diplomacy by the University of Nigeria, Nsukka and had since then been serving as research consultants to many local and international organizations including Stakeholder Democracy Network, SOAS University of London, United Nations office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), Aljazeera, BBC World Service, German National TV, VICE, etc with weekly live radio appearances for advocacy.
